


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What's Gone Wrong?

Refresher on Fatigue Requirements:

Please remember if you are driving for <u>5 hours</u>, the requirements are that you are to undertake a resting period of <u>20 minutes</u>. This can be completed in 1,2 or 3 short breaks but must equate to at least 20 minutes.

7 hours resting between shifts is the minimum requirement.

If you are performing loading requirements at CBH, farm etc please ensure you are recording this on your tablet as working, but not driving.


Resting – if you are at a roadhouse getting food in a truck stop eating, using the facilities – this is recorded on your tablet as resting.
