

## Marley's Mail – March 23






#### What's gone wrong:

A Marley's employee climbed his dog trailer on site to level out a load without any guard rails up. Fortunately, on this occasion, the driver was reminded about safe procedures and moved his truck to the platform to level the load safely without any injury. Please be reminded that you are not permitted to climb onto a trailer to level out a load. Do not take short cuts to avoid having to move your truck to the safety platform. Please seek assistance from site staff after loading who will use a safety platform to level your load out or do this yourself. Drivers have seriously injured themselves from falling off trailers in the past.

A workshop staff member attempted to park a truck in a bay between two other trailers. On this occasion, the staff member turned too late, causing the left side of his dog trailer to strike the right side of a livestock trailer. Please remember when parking in tight spaces to use a spotter to assist and turn the steering wheel in full lock when in line with the parking space. If in doubt at any time performing a parking manoeuvre, stop and assess.

A Marley's driver started his day in the line-up at Wesfeeds. He noticed a large dent and scratch on the right front compartment of his dog trailer. Inquiries revealed another driver had reversed his trailers into the truck to gain access to the bulk out loading area. Please ensure you use a spotter to reverse at Wesfeeds and stop and assess if you can't confirm clearance of your trailers when reversing. We are aware that sometimes a spotter may not be available. In this instance, only reverse the truck if you are confident and it's safe to do so.


A Marley's driver loaded up on site and was rolling the tarp over his lead trailer. While completing the task he had to lift the pole and push upwards to get the tarp over the grain. He felt pain and burning in his right shoulder and required medical treatment. Please ensure your trailers are level when loading and before rolling the tarp to avoid any injuries when manoeuvring the tarp pole.
