Marley's Notifications:

Driver Requirements: Drivers to write con notes for <u>ALL</u> feed deliveries – one to be left on farm and one supplied to our office.

Speed: A reminder to all persons entering/exiting and driving on site – The **MAXIMUM** Speed is 10 km/h, this includes trucks, forklifts, and vehicles. We do not have designated walking areas for pedestrian's – Please ensure you drop to 10 km/h on arrival to site.

PPE – High visible clothing, enclosed footwear is required by **ALL** (truck drivers, workshop, warehouse, visitors, admin & management) within Marley's sites. They are in place as a site safety requirement – HV shirts and jackets are essential especially during non-daylight hours to ensure your safety is maintained and you are clearly visible.

Enclosed footwear does not constitute thongs and socks, you are prohibited from entering the workshop unless approved enclosed footwear is applied. One slip is all it takes!!

What's gone wrong:

INC - Sub-contractor was rolling his tarp on when it got stuck halfway – driver made the decision to climb up on the trailer, levelled out the peak with his hand and then as he was descending he slipped or lost his grip (unable to remember) and fell from one of the top ladder rungs contacting the top of the chassis on the prime mover and continued to fall to the ground. The driver blacked out for a couple of minutes and was very lucky to only sustain some lacerations and bruising to his knee, head, and thigh. The driver fell from a height of an estimated 2.5 metres. At no time is it approved for a person to climb up on any trailer without fixed and applied edge protection. If a site provides a platform, you are to use the platform as the first option. If no edge protection or platform - You are advised to call management. CBH are putting together a flyer to raise the awareness about their operating equipment (stacker, MLS and dog stacker) - This will be released in the coming weeks as a flyer but also will be reinforced as an educational toll on their sites.

INC – Two truck were reversing in the same location at the same time at an external site. One was reversing to hook up to a trailer and the other was rolling backwards to exit after loading. Contact was made and a small amount of damage was sustained to the fuel tank of a prime mover. Please ensure before any reverse movements are commenced, all mirrors are checked, if available and required have a spotter in place and positive communications between both parties undertaken.

INC – Loaded stock crate was travelling on the highway in an overtaking section. As the road train had nearly completed the merge into a single lane a LV approached the rear of the stock crate and was anticipating overtaking. At that time the car appeared to lose control, swayed from side to side, clipped the side of the stock crate, and travelled across the opposite side of the road and rolled coming to a stop in between the trees. The two occupants were treated roadside. Always remain vigilant to your surroundings and actions of other road users.
