What's gone wrong:

INC 909 – Truck driver was travelling to his offloading destination when he drifted over the centre line towards another truck travelling in the opposite direction. Driver on realising yanked the steering wheel back towards his side of the road. The two trucks made contact at the driver side mirrors, resulting in an eye injury to the driver of the other truck. *Inattention or fatigue can kill, seeing machines will give you an alert in the event you have a micro sleep or inattention. This could be YOUR lifesaver.*

INC 911 - Truck driver following loading at a customer site – climbed up on his trailer to level out his load after departing the BOL area. The product was overloaded onto the tarp, the driver was unable to roll on his tarp at ground level. Driver made an error in judgment and climbed up on his trailer and commenced levelling out the load – this action placed the driver at risk of a fall from height. *Drivers are not approved to be working from any height without edge protection in place. Drivers/workers must use platforms, platform ladders, scissor lifts as their first option for any works at height.*



CEO Ben McNamara on the 26th August has released a notification to its Principal Road Contractors advising CBH has surpassed their previous annual shipping record. Last week they broke the (FY17) record 15.029mt shipped in a year, 21.3mt was surpassed when loading the vessel African lark at Kwinana Grain terminal.

They advise also that they have broken additional records from Geraldton Grain terminal (3.34mt), Esperance Grain terminal (3.08mt) and looking for also Albany by the end of 2022.
